Transitional Kindergarten, Kindergarten, New Student Enrollment and Intra-District Transfers for 2022-2023

Students whose 5th birthday falls between Sept. 2, 2017 and December 2, 2017 may enroll in **Transitional Kindergarten**. We will post what schools will be designated sites for the Transitional Kindergarten programs next year.

Students who turn 5 on or before September 1, 2017 may enroll in **Kindergarten.**

The enrollment portal has not open yet. Please refer to the Berryessa Union School District website in the coming weeks for more information. For Transitional Kinder, Kindergarten and First grade students, please contact your doctor now to make sure your child is up to date on all vaccines and schedule a physical exam if required.

COVID Testing Information:

Noble will have onsite covid testing for students every Tuesday. This is at no cost to parents. This testing may be used for routine weekly testing, parent directed testing, or for when students have symptoms. We ask that you test at our school site only. We are not sending kids to other school sites for testing. Students can only be tested with parent consent and a registration through the online system. This is a rapid test and results are sent to the email the parent registered with and not sent to us at the school site. You must register each student individually. CAMPUS SAFETY & SECURITY

As a staff we have concerns about the before and after school traffic around Noble School. Please consider the safety of every child when you are driving near our school and respect our efforts to keep everyone safe. Please follow all staff directions in and around campus as we are doing our best to keep everyone safe as well as set a good example for our kids. In addition, please follow the designated pattern of traffic flow when dropping off and picking up students that was designed for the safety of our children. This included **right turns only** out of our parking lot and turn around. It is important that everyone observe the **no parking** rule in the drive through area in front of the school and along all red curbs in the street. Please follow correct directional parking along our street. If you are dropping/loading your child off in the front turn-around, please make sure they unload or load on the right side of the car. This is for their safety and yours. When dropping off the driver must stay in the car. Parking in this area and opening driver side doors causes an unsafe condition for cars passing through to pick up or drop off students.

The ELPAC is the test that is used to measure how well students in kindergarten through twelfth grade understand English when it is not their primary language. The ELPAC is taking the place of the California English Language Development Test (CELDT). Information from the ELPAC helps your child's teacher provide support in the right areas. The Summative Assessment will be administered in Berryessa beginning February 5, 2018.
